**THE SALE**

**BONDS OFFERED FOR SALE BY COMPETITIVE BIDDING:** The Pleasant Grove Independent School District (the “District”) is offering for sale its \$39,900,000\* Unlimited Tax School Building Bonds, Series 2022 (the “Bonds”). **The Bonds will be awarded to the bid producing the lowest true interest cost rate. See “CONDITIONS OF THE SALE” herein.** An application has been filed with the Texas Education Agency and preliminary approval has been received for the Bonds to be guaranteed by the Permanent School Fund. See “THE PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND GUARANTEE PROGRAM” in the hereinafter described Official Statement. Bidders may submit their bids for the Bonds by either of the following methods:

- (1) Submit bids by telephone as described below in “BIDS BY TELEPHONE;” or
- (2) Submit bids electronically as described below in “ELECTRONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE.”

**BIDS BY TELEPHONE:** Bidders must submit, prior to the Sale Date, signed Official Bid Forms to Lucas Janda, Live Oak Public Finance, LLC, 1515 S. Capital of Texas Highway, Suite 206, Austin, Texas 78746, and submit their bid by telephone on the Sale Date. **Telephone bids will be accepted at 512-799-2619 or 512-726-5547, between 9:30 a.m. (CDT) and 10:00 a.m. (CDT) on the Sale Date.** Live Oak Public Finance, LLC will not be responsible for submitting any bids received after the deadline.

**ELECTRONIC BIDDING PROCEDURE:** Any prospective bidder that intends to submit an electronic bid must submit its electronic bid via PARITY (“PARITY”). Bidders **MUST SUBMIT PRIOR TO THE SALE DATE SIGNED** Official Bid Forms to Lucas Janda, Live Oak Public Finance, LLC, 1515 S. Capital of Texas Highway, Suite 206, Austin, Texas 78746. **Electronic bids will be accepted via the electronic media described below by 10:00 a.m. (CDT) on the Sale Date. Any bid received after the scheduled time for receipt will not be accepted.**

The official time for the receipt of electronic bids shall be the time maintained by PARITY. All electronic bids shall be deemed to incorporate the provisions of this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, Official Bid Form and the Official Statement. To the extent that any instructions or directions set forth in PARITY conflict with this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, the terms of this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions shall control. For further information about PARITY, potential bidders may contact PARITY at (212) 806-8304.

An electronic bid made through PARITY shall be deemed an irrevocable offer to purchase the Bonds on the terms provided in this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions, and shall be binding upon the bidder as if made by a signed and sealed bid delivered to the District. The District shall not be responsible for any malfunction or mistake made by, or as a result of the use of PARITY, the use of such facilities being at the sole risk of the prospective bidder.

**PLACE AND TIME OF BID OPENING:** The bids for the Bonds will be opened by the District at 10:00 a.m. (CDT) on the Sale Date.

**AWARD OF THE BONDS:** The Board of Trustees (the “Board”) of the District will take action to award the Bonds (or reject all bids) at a regular meeting to commence at approximately 6:00p.m. (CDT) on the Sale Date. Upon award of the Bonds to the winning bidder (the “Initial Purchaser”), the Board will adopt an order authorizing the issuance of the Bonds (the “Order”). The District reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any irregularities except time of submission. All bids must comply with the requirements listed under “ADDITIONAL CONDITION OF AWARD – DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTY FORM.”

#### **ADDITIONAL CONDITION OF AWARD — DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTED PARTY FORM**

**OBLIGATION OF THE DISTRICT TO RECEIVE INFORMATION FROM WINNING BIDDER.** Pursuant to Texas Government Code, Section 2252.908, the District may not award the Bonds to a bidder unless each entity executing the Official Bid Form either: (a) submits a Certificate of Interested Parties Form 1295 (the “Disclosure Form”) to the District as prescribed by the Texas Ethics Commission (“TEC”), or (b) represents to the District by marking the appropriate box on the signature page of the Official Bid Form that the bidder is a publicly traded business entity or a wholly owned subsidiary of a publicly traded business entity (the “Publicly Traded Entity Representation”). In the event that the bidder’s bid for the Bonds is the best bid received and at least one entity executing the Official Bid Form does not provide the Publicly Traded Entity Representation, the District, acting through its financial advisor, will promptly notify the bidder. That notification will serve as the conditional verbal acceptance of the bid and the winning bidder must promptly file the Disclosure Form materials described below for the entity/entities not making the Publicly Traded Entity Representation. In the event that the bidder’s bid for the Bonds is the best bid received and each entity executing the Official Bid Form provides the Publicly Traded Entity Representation, the District, acting through its financial advisor, will promptly notify the bidder. That notification will serve as the final verbal acceptance of the bid, subject only to written acceptance of the bid by the President of the Board of Trustees or the Superintendent of the District.

**PROCESS FOR COMPLETING THE DISCLOSURE FORM.** The Disclosure Form can be found at [https://www.ethics.state.tx.us/whatsnew/elf\\_info\\_form1295.htm](https://www.ethics.state.tx.us/whatsnew/elf_info_form1295.htm) and reference should be made to the following information in order to complete it: (a) item 2 – Name of District (“Pleasant Grove Independent School District”), (b) item 3 – the identification number (“Pleasant Grove ISD 2022 Bonds”), and (c) item 3 – description of the goods or services assigned to this contract by the District (“Pleasant Grove ISD Series 2022 Bonds”).

**If one or more of the entities executing the Official Bid Form do not provide the Publicly Traded Entity Representation, the District cannot accept your bid unless and until each such entity:**

- (i) completes the Disclosure Form electronically at the TEC’s “electronic portal”, and**
- (ii) prints, signs and delivers a copy of the Disclosure Form that is generated by the TEC’s “electronic portal.”**

**These materials must be delivered electronically to the District’s Co-Bond Counsel at [john.hall@cantuharden.com](mailto:john.hall@cantuharden.com), and Financial Advisor at [ljanda@liveoakpf.com](mailto:ljanda@liveoakpf.com) no later than 1:00 p.m. (CDT) on the Sale Date.**

If the Disclosure Form is required, time will be of the essence in submitting the form to the District, and no bid will be accepted by the District unless a completed Disclosure Form is received on time. If multiple entities are listed on the winning Official Bid Form, each such entity will be required to submit a Disclosure Form or make the Publicly Traded Entity Representation.

Neither the District nor its consultants have the ability to verify the information included in a Disclosure Form, and neither have an obligation nor undertake responsibility for advising any bidder with respect to the proper completion of the Disclosure Form. Consequently, an entity intending to bid on the Bonds should consult its own advisors to the extent it deems necessary and be prepared, if necessary, to submit the completed form promptly upon notification from the District that its bid is the conditional winning bid.

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## THE BONDS

**DESCRIPTION:** The Bonds will be dated August 11, 2022. Interest on the Bonds will accrue from the date of delivery and will be due on February 15, 2023, and each August 15 and February 15 thereafter until maturity or earlier redemption. The Bonds will be issued only in fully registered form in any integral multiple of \$5,000 of principal for any one maturity. **The Bonds are being sold on an all or none basis.**

**ADJUSTMENT OF PRINCIPAL AMOUNT AND MATURITY SCHEDULE FOR THE BONDS:** After final computation of the bids, the District reserves the right in its sole discretion either to decrease, increase or eliminate entirely the principal amount of any maturity of the Bonds. **If the premium bid for the Bonds is significantly higher than the requested minimum premium shown herein under “CONDITIONS OF THE SALE - TYPE OF BIDS AND INTEREST RATES,” it is possible that the total adjustment could exceed 10% of the total par amount of Bonds and/or 10% of any or all maturities.**

Such adjustment(s), if any, shall be made within four (4) hours of the final award of the Bonds. The price at which such adjusted principal amount of Bonds will be sold will be the same price per \$1,000 of Bonds as the price per \$1,000 for the original par amount of Bonds bid. In order to calculate the yield on the Bonds for federal tax law purposes and as a condition precedent to the award of the Bonds, bidders must disclose to the District in connection with their respective bids the price (or yield) at which each maturity of the Bonds will be reoffered and sold or expected to be sold to the public. See attached “Certificate Regarding Issue Price.”

In the event of any adjustment of the maturity schedule for the Bonds as described herein, no rebidding or recalculation of the proposals submitted will be required or permitted. Any such adjustment of the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds and/or the maturity schedule for the Bonds made by the District or its Financial Advisor shall be subsequent to the award of the Bonds to the winning bidder as determined pursuant to “CONDITIONS OF THE SALE–BASIS FOR AWARD” herein and shall not affect such determination. The successful bidder may not withdraw its bid as a result of any changes made within the aforementioned limits. If such adjustment is made, it is possible that the actual cash premium generated in the transaction may result in a cash premium amount less than or greater than the amounts shown in the bid for the Bonds.

There is no guarantee that adjustments and/or revisions will not be necessary in order to properly size the Bonds. Accordingly, the District reserves the right in its sole discretion to make adjustments as previously described above, even if the issue size of the Bonds does not change from the original par amount of Bonds. In the event of any such adjustment and or revision, no rebidding will be permitted, and the purchase price as may have been bid on the Bonds shall be adjusted accordingly.

**OPTIONAL REDEMPTION:** The Bonds maturing on or after February 15, 2032, are subject to optional redemption in whole or in part on February 15, 2031, or any date thereafter, at a price equal to the principal amount thereof, plus accrued interest from the most recent interest payment date to the date of redemption. See “THE BONDS—Redemption Provision of the Bonds” in the Official Statement.

**AUTHORITY FOR ISSUANCE AND SECURITY FOR PAYMENT:** The Bonds are issued pursuant to the Constitution and general laws of the State, including Sections 45.001 and 45.003(b)(1) of the Texas Education Code, as amended (together, the “Financing Act”), an election held in the District on May 7, 2022, and the Bond Order to be adopted by the Board on July 14, 2022.

The Bonds are direct obligations of the District payable from the proceeds of an annual ad valorem tax levied, without legal limit as to rate or amount, on all taxable property located within the District as provided in the Order. See “THE BONDS–Security for Payment” and “STATE AND LOCAL FUNDING OF SCHOOL DISTRICTS IN TEXAS” in the Official Statement. Additionally, District has applied for and anticipates receiving conditional approval from the Texas Education Agency for the payment of principal of and interest on the Bonds to be guaranteed under the Permanent School Fund Guarantee Program which guarantee will automatically become effective when the Attorney General of Texas approves the Bonds. See “THE PERMANENT SCHOOL FUND GUARANTEE PROGRAM” in the Official Statement.

**SERIAL BONDS OR SERIAL BONDS AND TERM BONDS:** Bidders may provide that all the Bonds be issued as serial Bonds maturing in accordance with the Maturity Schedule shown on the Official Bid Form (Alternative 1) or as a combination of serial Bonds and term Bonds (Alternative 2), but a bid with term Bonds is permitted only as described in Alternative 2 below.

Alternative 1 - Serial Bonds:

Serial Bonds maturing on February 15, 2023 through February 15, 2052

Alternative 2 – Serial Bonds and Term Bonds:

One or more term bonds consisting of the February 15, 2023 through February 15, 2052 maturities with such term bond consisting of two or more consecutive annual principal amounts accumulated from the Maturity Schedule shown on the Official Bid Form. Bidders may reestablish Serial Bonds following a Term Bond.

**MANDATORY SINKING FUND:** If the successful bidder elects to alter the Maturity Schedule and convert the principal amounts of the Bonds maturing in the years 2023 through 2052 into one or more “Term Bonds”, each such “Term Bond” shall be subject to mandatory redemption on August 15 following the last maturity for serial Bonds, and annually thereafter on each August 15 until the stated maturity for the Term Bonds at the redemption prices of par plus accrued interest to the date of redemption. The principal amounts of the Term Bonds to be redeemed on each mandatory redemption date shall be the principal amounts that would have been due and payable in the Maturity Schedule shown on the Official Bid Form had no conversion to Term Bonds occurred. At least forty-five (45) days prior to each mandatory redemption date, the Paying Agent/Registrar (defined below) shall select, by lot, or other customary random selective method, the Term Bonds to be redeemed and cause a notice of redemption to be given in the manner provided in the Order.

**BOOK-ENTRY-ONLY SYSTEM:** The District intends to utilize the Book-Entry-Only System of The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York (“DTC”). See “THE BONDS-Book-Entry-Only System” in the Official Statement.

**PAYING AGENT/REGISTRAR:** The initial Paying Agent/Registrar shall be BOK Financial, Dallas Texas (the “Paying Agent/Registrar”). See “REGISTRATION, TRANSFER AND EXCHANGE - Paying Agent/Registrar” in the Official Statement.

**QUALIFIED TAX-EXEMPT OBLIGATIONS:** The District will NOT designate the Bonds as “qualified tax-exempt obligations.” Further details regarding the Bonds are set forth in the Official Statement.

#### **CONDITIONS OF THE SALE**

**TYPE OF BIDS AND INTEREST RATES:** The Bonds will be sold in one block on an “all or none” basis. No bid producing a cash premium on the Bonds of less than \$1,463,543.00 will be considered; provided, however, that any bid is subject to adjustment as described under the caption “THE BONDS-ADJUSTMENT OF PRINCIPAL AMOUNT AND MATURITY SCHEDULE FOR THE BONDS.” Bidders are invited to name the rate(s) of interest to be borne by the Bonds, provided that each rate bid must be in a multiple of 1/8 of 1% or 1/20 of 1% and the highest interest rate specified for any maturity may not exceed the lowest rate bid by more than 3% in rate. No limitation is imposed upon bidders as to the number of rates or changes that may be used. All Bonds of one maturity must bear one and the same rate. No bids involving supplemental interest rates will be considered. Each bidder shall state the true interest cost rate of its bid, which shall be considered informative only and not as a part of the bid.

**BASIS FOR AWARD:** The sale of the Bonds will be awarded to the bidder making a bid that conforms to the specifications herein and which produces the lowest true interest cost rate on the Bonds only to the District. The true interest cost rate is that annual rate which, when used to compute the total present value as of the Delivery Date of all debt service payments on the Bonds on the basis of using a 360-day year composed of 12 consecutive 30-day months, produces an amount equal to the sum of the par value of the Bonds plus any premium bid. In the event of the bidder’s error in interest cost calculations, the interest rates and premium, if any, set forth in the Official Bid Form will be considered as the intended bid.

**GOOD FAITH DEPOSIT:** A Good Faith Deposit, payable to the “Pleasant Grove Independent School District” in the amount of \$798,000.00 is required. Such Good Faith Deposit shall be a bank cashier’s check or certified check, which is to be retained uncashed by the District pending the Initial Purchaser’s compliance with the terms of the Official Bid Form and this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions. The Good Faith Deposit may accompany the Official Bid Form or it may be submitted separately. If submitted separately it shall be made available to the District prior to the opening of the bids and shall be accompanied by instructions from

the bank on which drawn which authorize its use as a Good Faith Deposit by the Initial Purchaser who shall be named in such instructions. The Good Faith Deposit of the Initial Purchaser will be returned to the Initial Purchaser upon payment for the Bonds. No interest will be allowed on the Good Faith Deposit. In the event the Initial Purchaser should fail or refuse to take up and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the bid, then said check shall be cashed and accepted by the District as full and complete liquidated damages. The checks accompanying bids other than the winning bid will be returned immediately after the bids are opened and an award of the Bonds has been made.

The District reserves the right to reject any and all bids and to waive any irregularities except time of submission.

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## **DELIVERY OF THE BONDS AND ACCOMPANYING DOCUMENTS**

**CUSIP NUMBERS:** It is anticipated that CUSIP identification numbers will appear on the Bonds, but neither the failure to print or type such number on any Bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the Initial Purchaser to accept delivery of and pay for the Bonds in accordance with the terms of this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions and the terms of the Official Bid Form. All expenses in relation to the printing or typing of CUSIP numbers on the Bonds shall be paid by the District; provided, however, that the CUSIP Global Services charge for assignment of the numbers shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the Initial Purchaser.

**DELIVERY OF BONDS:** Delivery will be accomplished by the issuance of an initial Bond, either in typed or printed form, in the total aggregate principal amount of \$39,900,000.00\*, signed by the President and Secretary of the Board, approved by the Texas Attorney General, and registered and manually signed by the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts. Upon delivery of the initial Bond, the initial Bond shall be immediately cancelled and one definitive Bond for each maturity will be registered and delivered only to Cede and Co. and deposited with DTC in connection with DTC's Book-Entry-Only System. Delivery will be at the office of the Paying Agent/Registrar in Austin, Texas.

Payment for the Bonds must be made in immediately available funds for unconditional credit to the District, or as otherwise directed by the District. The Initial Purchaser will be given six business days' notice of the time fixed for delivery of the Bonds. It is anticipated that delivery of the Bonds can be made on or about August 11, 2022 and it is understood and agreed that the Initial Purchaser will accept delivery and make payment for the Bonds by 10:00 a.m. (CDT) on August 11, 2022 or thereafter on the date the Bonds are tendered for delivery, up to and including August 25, 2022. If for any reason the District is unable to make delivery on or before August 25, 2022, the District shall immediately contact the Initial Purchaser and offer to allow the Initial Purchaser to extend its offer for an additional thirty days. If the Initial Purchaser does not elect to extend its offer within six days thereafter, then its Good Faith Deposit will be returned, and both the District and the Initial Purchaser shall be relieved of any further obligation. In no event shall the District be liable for any damages by reason of its failure to deliver the Bonds, provided such failure is due to circumstances reasonably beyond the District's control.

**CONDITIONS TO DELIVERY:** The obligation of the Initial Purchaser to take up and pay for the Bonds is subject to the Initial Purchaser's receipt of (a) the legal opinion of Cantu Harden LLP, San Antonio, Texas and Walsh Gallegos ("Co-Bond Counsel"), (b) the no litigation certificate, and (c) the certificate as to the Official Statement, all as further described in the Official Statement. Items (b) and (c) above may be contained in one or more certificates.

In order to provide the District with information required to enable it to comply with certain conditions of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 as amended (the "Code"), relating to the exemption of interest on the Bonds from the gross income of their owners, the Initial Purchaser will be required to complete, execute, and deliver to the District a certification as to their "issue price" substantially in the form and to the effect attached hereto or accompanying this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions. In no event will the District fail to deliver the Bonds as a result of the Initial Purchaser's inability to sell a substantial amount of the Bonds at a particular price prior to delivery. Each bidder, by submitting its bid, agrees to complete, execute, and deliver such a certificate by the date of delivery of the Bonds, if its bid is accepted by the District. It will be the responsibility of the Initial Purchaser to institute such syndicate reporting requirements to make such investigation, or otherwise to ascertain the facts necessary to enable it to make such certification with reasonable certainty. Any questions concerning such certification should be directed to Co-Bond Counsel.

**COMPETITIVE BIDDING AND CERTIFICATE REGARDING ISSUE PRICE:** In the event that the District does not receive sufficient qualified bids to satisfy the competitive sale requirements of Treasury Regulation § 1.148-1(f)(3)(i), allowing the District to treat the reasonably expected initial offering price to the public as of the sale date as the issue price of the Bonds, the District will treat (i) the first price at which 10 percent of a maturity of the Bonds is sold to the public as the issue price of that maturity (the "10 percent rule") or (b) if the Initial Purchaser has agreed in writing not to sell or offer maturities of the Bonds at a price higher than the initial offering price for such maturities for a period of five business days after the sale date, the initial offering price to the public as of the sale date of such maturities of the Bonds is the issue price of that maturity (the "hold the price rule"). If the 10 percent rule has not been satisfied as to any maturity of the Bonds, the Initial Purchaser agrees to promptly report to Live Oak Public Finance, LLC, the prices at which it sells Bonds of that maturity to the public. This reporting obligation shall continue, whether or not the Bonds have been delivered, until the 10 percent rule has been satisfied. The attached Certificate Regarding Issue Price has language for (I) when the competitive sale requirements of Treasury Regulation § 1.148-1(f)(3)(i) are met and (II) when such requirements are not met.

**LEGAL OPINIONS:** The Bonds are offered when, as and if issued, subject to the approval of the Attorney General of the State of Texas. Delivery of and payment for the Bonds is subject to the receipt by the Initial Purchaser of the opinion of Co-Bond Counsel, in substantially the form as attached to the Official Statement as "APPENDIX C."

**CERTIFICATION OF OFFICIAL STATEMENT:** At the time of payment for and initial delivery of the Bonds, the District will execute and deliver to the Initial Purchaser a certificate in the form set forth in the Official Statement.

**CHANGE IN TAX-EXEMPT STATUS:** At any time before the Bonds are tendered for delivery, the Initial Purchaser may withdraw its bid if the interest received by private holders on bonds of the same type and character as the Bonds shall be declared to be taxable income under present federal income tax laws, either by ruling of the Internal Revenue Service or by a decision of any federal court, or shall be declared taxable or be required to be taken into account in computing any federal income taxes, by the terms of any federal income tax law enacted subsequent to the date of this Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions.

### **GENERAL**

**FINANCIAL ADVISOR:** Live Oak Public Finance, LLC is employed as financial advisor to the District (the "Financial Advisor") in connection with the issuance of the Bonds. The Financial Advisor's fee for services rendered with respect to the sale of the Bonds is contingent upon the issuance and delivery of the Bonds. Live Oak Public Finance, LLC, in its capacity as Financial Advisor, has relied on the opinion of Co-Bond Counsel and has not verified and does not assume any responsibility for the information, covenants and representations contained in any of the legal documents with respect to the federal income tax status of the Bonds, or the possible impact of any present, pending or future actions taken by any legislative or judicial bodies.

**BLUE SKY LAWS:** By submission of its bid, the Initial Purchaser represents that the sale of the Bonds in states other than Texas will be made only pursuant to exemptions from registration or, where necessary, the Initial Purchaser will register the Bonds in accordance with the securities law of the states in which the Bonds are offered or sold. The District agrees to cooperate with the Initial Purchaser, at the Initial Purchaser's written request and expense, in registering the Bonds or obtaining an exemption from registration in any state where such action is necessary, provided, however, that the District shall not be obligated to incur any costs or execute a general or special consent to service of process or register as a foreign corporation in any such jurisdiction.

**NOT AN OFFER TO SELL:** This Official Notice of Sale and Bidding Instructions does not alone constitute an offer to sell the Bonds but is merely notice of sale of the Bonds. The undersigned, being a duly authorized representative of the underwriter or the manager of the syndicate of underwriters (“Initial Purchaser”) which has purchased the Unlimited Tax School Building Bonds, Series 2022, being issued by the Pleasant Grove Independent School District (the “District”), hereby certifies as set forth below with respect to the sale and issuance of the above-captioned obligations (the “Bonds”) of Pleasant Grove Independent School District (the “Issuer”).

1. ***Sale of the General Rule Maturities.*** As of the date of this certificate, for each Maturity of the General Rule Maturities, the first price at which at least 10% of such Maturity was sold to the Public is the respective price listed in Schedule A.

2. ***Defined Terms.***

(a) *General Rule Maturities* means those Maturities of the Bonds listed in Schedule A hereto as the “General Rule Maturities.”

(b) *Maturity* means Bonds with the same credit and payment terms. Bonds with different maturity dates, or Bonds with the same maturity date but different stated interest rates, are treated as separate maturities.

(c) *Public* means any person (including an individual, trust, estate, partnership, association, company, or corporation) other than an Underwriter or a related party to an Underwriter. The term “related party” for purposes of this certificate generally means any two or more persons who have greater than 50 percent common ownership, directly or indirectly.

(d) *Sale Date* means the first day on which there is a binding contract in writing for the sale of a Maturity of the Bonds. The Sale Date of the Bonds is July 14, 2022.

(e) *Underwriter* means (i) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract with the Issuer (or with the lead underwriter to form an underwriting syndicate) to participate in the initial sale of the Bonds to the Public, and (ii) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract directly or indirectly with a person described in clause (i) of this paragraph to participate in the initial sale of the Bonds to the Public (including a member of a selling group or a party to a retail or other third-party distribution agreement participating in the initial sale of the Bonds to the Public).

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The representations set forth in this certificate are limited to factual matters only. Nothing in this certificate represents the Initial Purchaser interpretation of any laws, including specifically Sections 103 and 148 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986, as amended, and the Treasury Regulations thereunder. The undersigned understands that the foregoing information will be relied upon by the Issuer with respect to certain of the representations set forth in the tax certificate with respect to the Bonds and with respect to compliance with the federal income tax rules affecting the Bonds, and by Cantu Harden LLP in connection with rendering its opinion that the interest on the Bonds is excluded from gross income for federal income tax purposes, the preparation of the Internal Revenue Service Form 8038-G, and other federal income tax advice that it may give to the Issuer from time to time relating to the Bonds.
