NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that bids will be received by the Borough of Pitman, in the County of Gloucester, State of New Jersey (the "Borough") for the purchase of the Borough's \$9,539,000* aggregate principal amount of General Obligation Bonds, Series 2025 (the "General Obligation Bonds" or the "Bonds"), consisting of \$6,541,000* General Improvement Bonds, Series 2025 (the "General Improvement Bonds"), and \$2,998,000* Water and Sewer Utility Bonds, Series 2025 (the "Water and Sewer Utility Bonds"). All Bids (as defined below) must be submitted in their entirety via "PARITY Electronic Bid Submission System" ("PARITY") prior to 11:00 a.m., prevailing New Jersey time on August 7, 2025. To bid, Bidders (as defined below) must have submitted a good faith check or wire, payable to the Borough, in the amount of \$190,780 by no later than 11:00 a.m. on the Bid Date (see Bidding Details below).

Preliminary and Final Official Statement

The Borough's Preliminary Official Statement (the "POS") is available for viewing in electronic format on www.govdebt.net. In addition, broker dealers registered with the National Association of Securities Dealers (the "NASD") and dealer banks with The Depository Trust Company, New York, New York (the "DTC") clearing arrangements may either: (a) print out a copy of the POS on their own printer, or (b) at any time prior to 11:00 p.m. on August 7, 2025, elect to receive a photocopy of the POS in the mail by requesting it on PARITY or by calling the Borough's Bond Counsel, Archer & Greiner P.C., 10 Highway 35, Red Bank, New Jersey 07701. All Bidders must review the POS and certify that they have done so prior to participating in the bidding.

The POS is deemed by the Borough to be final as of its date, for purposes of Rule 15c2-12 (the "Rule"), promulgated by the Securities and Exchange Commission pursuant to the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, as amended and supplemented, except for the omission of information concerning the offering price(s), interest rate(s), selling compensation, aggregate principal amount of the Bonds and any other terms or provisions to be determined from the successful Bid(s) or depending on such matters, and the identity of the underwriter(s). The POS is, however, subject to such further revisions, amendments and completion in a Final Official Statement (the "Official Statement"), as may be necessary.

The Borough at its expense, will make available to the Winning Bidder (as defined herein) a reasonable number of Official Statements within seven (7) business days following the date of acceptance of the Bid.

Types of Bids Allowed

Subject to the Bid requirements described below, Bids for the Bonds must be submitted on an "All-or-None" ("AON") basis for the entire amount of \$9,539,000^{*}. First, a Bidder must submit a conforming Bid for the entire issue, and if such Bid is accepted by the Borough, the Bidder will be required to purchase the entire issue in accordance with such Bid.

Insurance

If the Bonds qualify for the issuance of any policy of municipal bond insurance, the Bidder of the Bonds may, at its sole option and expense, purchase such insurance. The insurance premium, if any, will be paid by the Bidder. Any failure of the Bonds to be so insured shall not in any way relieve the Winning Bidder of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its proposal for the purchase of the Bonds.

Interest Payment Dates; Description of the Bonds

The Bonds will be dated their date of delivery and will bear interest from such date payable semiannually on each February 1 and August 1 (each an "Interest Payment Date"), commencing February 1, 2026 in each year until maturity or prior redemption, as applicable, by payment of money to DTC or its authorized nominee. DTC will credit payments of principal of and interest on the Bonds to the Participants of DTC as listed on the records of DTC as of each January 15 and July 15 preceding each Interest Payment Date for the Bonds (the "Record Dates").

Principal Amortization

The Bonds will consist of one series of serial bonds maturing on August 1 in each year, commencing August 1, 2026, as indicated in the maturity schedule set forth below.

Book-Entry Only

The Bonds will be issued in book-entry only form, and each certificate will be registered in the name of Cede & Co., as nominee of DTC, which will act as securities depository for the Bonds. The Bonds will be issued in the form of one certificate for the aggregate principal amount of the Bonds maturing in each year and will be payable as to both principal and interest in lawful money of the United States of America. The certificates will be on deposit with DTC. DTC will be responsible for maintaining a book-entry system for recording the interests of its Participants or the

transfers of the interests among its Participants. The Participants will be responsible for maintaining records regarding the beneficial ownership interests in the Bonds on behalf of the individual purchasers. The Winning Bidder will not receive certificates representing its interests in the Bonds. Individual purchases may be made in the principal amount of \$5,000 each or any integral multiple thereof, except that any bonds in excess of the largest principal amount equaling a multiple of \$5,000 shall be in denominations of \$1,000 or any integral multiple thereof, through book entries made on the books and records of DTC and its participants. Payments of principal, interest and redemption premium, if any, will be made by the Borough or a designated paying agent to DTC for subsequent disbursement to Participants to then be remitted to the Beneficial Owners of the Bonds. It shall be the obligation of the Winning Bidder to furnish to DTC an underwriter's questionnaire and the denominations of the Bonds not less than seventy-two (72) hours prior to the delivery of the Bonds.

Redemption Provisions

The Bonds of this issue maturing prior to August 1, 2033 are not subject to redemption prior to their stated maturities. The Bonds of this issue maturing on or after August 1, 2033 are subject to redemption at the option of the Borough, in whole or in part, on any date on or after August 1, 2032, upon notice as required herein at one hundred percent (100%) of the principal amount being redeemed (the "Redemption Price"), plus accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption.

Notice of redemption ("Notice of Redemption") shall be given by mailing such notice at least thirty (30) days but not more than sixty (60) days before the date fixed for redemption by first class mail in a sealed envelope with postage prepaid to the registered owners of such Bonds at their respective addresses as they last appear on the registration books kept for that purpose by the Borough or a duly appointed Bond Registrar. So long as DTC (or any successor thereto) acts as Securities Depository for the Bonds, Notice of Redemption shall be sent to such Securities Depository and shall not be sent to the beneficial owners of the Bonds. Any failure of the Securities Depository to advise any of its participants or any failure of any participant to notify any beneficial owner of any Notice of Redemption shall not affect the validity of the redemption proceedings. If the Borough determines to redeem a portion of the Bonds prior to maturity, such Bonds shall be selected by the Borough; the Bonds to be redeemed having the same maturity shall be selected by the Securities Depository in accordance with its regulations.

If Notice of Redemption has been given as provided herein, the Bonds or the portion thereof called for redemption shall be due and payable on the date fixed for redemption at the Redemption Price, together with accrued interest to the date fixed for redemption. Interest shall cease to accrue on the Bonds after the date fixed for redemption.

Term Bond Option

Bidders may **not** elect to structure the issue to include term bonds.

Terms of PARITY

Each electronic proposal must be submitted via PARITY. No bidder will see any other bidder's bid, nor will any bidder see the status of its bid relative to other bids (e.g., whether its bid is a leading bid). To the extent any instructions or directions set forth on PARITY conflict with this Notice of Sale, the terms of this Notice of Sale shall control. For further information about PARITY, potential bidders may contact PARITY at (212) 404-8102. The Borough may, but is not obligated to, acknowledge its acceptance in writing of any bid submitted electronically

via PARITY. When a bid for the Bonds is submitted via PARITY, the bidder further agrees that: the Borough may regard the electronic transmission of the bid via PARITY (including information about the purchase price of the Bonds, the interest rate or rates to be borne by the various maturities of the Bonds specified, the initial public offering price of each maturity of the Bonds and any other information included in such transmission) as the official "Proposal for Bonds" executed by a duly authorized signatory of the bidder. If the bid submitted electronically via PARITY is accepted by the Borough, the terms of the bid and this Notice of Sale and the information that is electronically transmitted via PARITY shall form a contract, and the successful bidder shall be bound by the terms of such contract.

PARITY is not an agent of the Borough, and the Borough shall have no liability whatsoever based on any bidder's use of PARITY including, but not limited to, any failure by PARITY to correctly or timely transmit information provided by the Borough or information provided by the bidder.

The Borough may choose to discontinue use of electronic bidding via PARITY by issuing a notification to such effect via Thomson News Service ("TM3"), or by other available means, no later than 3:00 p.m., New Jersey Time, on the last business date prior to the bid date.

Once the bids are communicated electronically via PARITY to the Borough, each bid will constitute an official "Proposal for Bonds" and shall be deemed to be an irrevocable offer to purchase the Bonds on the terms provided in this Notice of Sale. For purposes of submitting all "Proposals for Bonds" electronically via PARITY, the time as maintained on PARITY shall constitute the official time.

Each bidder shall be solely responsible to make necessary arrangements to access PARITY for purposes of submitting its bid in a timely manner and in compliance with the requirements of this Notice of Sale. Neither the Borough nor PARITY shall have any duty or obligation to provide or assure to any bidder, and neither the Borough nor PARITY shall be responsible for the proper operation of, or have any liability for any delays or interruptions of, or any damages caused by, PARITY. The Borough is using PARITY as a communication mechanism, and not as the Borough's agent, to conduct the electronic bidding for the Bonds. By using PARITY, each bidder agrees to hold the Borough harmless for any harm or damages caused to such bidder in connection with its use of PARITY for bidding on the Bonds.

The Borough may, in its sole discretion and prior to the electronic receipt of proposals, clarify any term hereof, including, without limitation, its decision to discontinue use of electronic bidding via PARITY, by issuing a notification of the clarification via TM3, or any other available means, no later than 3:00 p.m. (prevailing New Jersey time) on the last business day prior to the Bid Date.

Bidding Details

- (3) All Bids must be submitted on the Parity. No telephone, telefax, telegraph or personal delivery Bids will be accepted.
- (4) All Bids for the Bonds must be submitted on an AON basis.
- (5) Bidders must bid to purchase Bonds from the Borough with a premium of at least \$95,390, representing a minimum bid price of \$9,634,390 (101%). Bidders may also bid to purchase Bonds from the Borough with a premium not to exceed \$476,950, representing a maximum bid price of \$10,015,950 (105%).
- (6) Each proposal submitted must name the rate or rates of interest per annum to be borne by the Bonds and the rate or rates named must be multiples of one eighth or one twentieth of one per centum. Not more than one rate may be named for the Bonds of the same maturity. There is no limitation on the number of rates that may be named. The difference between the lowest and the highest rates named in the proposal shall not exceed two per centum (2%). The Bonds will be awarded to the bidder on whose bid the total loan may be made at the lowest true interest cost ("TIC"). Such TIC cost shall be computed by determining the interest rate, compounded semi-annually, necessary to discount the debt service payments to the date of the bonds and to the price bid, excluding interest accrued to the delivery date. Each proposal submitted must be for all of the Bonds and the purchase price specified in the proposal must be not less than \$9,634,390 (101%) nor more than \$10,015,950 (105%). No proposal shall be considered that offers to pay an amount less than the principal amount of the Bonds offered for sale or under which the total loan is made at a TIC higher than the lowest TIC to the Borough under any legally acceptable proposal, and if two or more such bidders offer to pay the lowest TIC, then the Bonds will be sold to one of such bidders selected by lot from among all such bidders. The purchaser must also pay an amount equal to the interest (if any) on the Bonds accrued to the date of payment of the purchase price. The right is reserved to reject all bids and to reject any bid not complying with this Notice.
- (7) Bidders are only permitted to submit Bids for the Bonds during the bidding period.

(8) The Winning Bidder shall be obligated to furnish to the Borough within forty-eight (48) hours of the Bid Date (i) the public offering prices and reoffering yields for each maturity of the Bonds, and (ii) an arbitrage yield calculation for the Bonds.

Definitions

"Bid" any confirmed purchase offer received by PARITY on or before the

auction deadline.

"Bidder" any firm registered and approved for participation in sales.

"True Interest Cost" computed by determining the interest rate, compounded semiannually,

necessary to discount the debt service payments to the date of the Bonds and to the price bid, excluding accrued interest to the delivery date. The True Interest Cost serves as the basis for awarding bonds to

Winning Bidders.

"Winning Bid" any purchase offer made by a Bidder and received by by PARITY that,

at the end of the bidding time period, results in the lowest True Interest

Cost ("TIC") that is acceptable to the Borough.

Bid Procedure and Basis of Award

Subject to the right reserved by the Borough to reject any or all Bids, the Bonds will be sold to the Bidder whose Bid complies with the Notice of Sale and produces the lowest True Interest Cost for the Borough based upon the maturity schedule set forth in the Notice of Sale.

Bids must remain valid until at least 3:00 p.m., prevailing time, on the date of the sale, and if accepted by the Borough, prior to such time, shall be irrevocable except as otherwise provided in the Notice of Sale. Upon selection of the winning Bidder, the Borough will execute an award certificate to award the Bonds and will promptly communicate with the winning Bidder by telephone, e-mail or fax.

Bid Security and Method of Payment for Bonds

A Good Faith Deposit ("Deposit") in the form of a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check or wire in the amount of \$190,780 payable to the order of the Borough, is required for each Bid to be considered. Wire instructions can be obtained by contacting Borough's Municipal Advisor, Bryan Morris of Phoenix Advisors, a division of First Security Municipal Advisors, Inc., Hamilton, New Jersey at (609) 291-0130 or via email to: bmorris@muniadvisors.com. Such wire must be received and confirmed by the Borough prior to the time for bids to be submitted. If a check is used, it must be a certified, treasurer's or cashier's check and must be provided to the Borough no later than by 11:00 a.m. on the Bid Date. Each bidder accepts responsibility for delivering such check on time and the Borough is not responsible for any check that is not received on time. No interest on the Deposit will accrue to the Purchaser. The Deposit will be applied to the purchase price of the Bonds. In the event the Purchaser fails to honor its accepted bid, the Deposit will be retained by the Borough. Award of the Bonds to the successful Bidder or rejection of all Bids is expected to be made within two hours after opening of the bids, but such successful Bidder may not withdraw its proposal until after 3:00 p.m. of the day of receipt of such Bids and then only if such award has not been made prior to the withdrawal. The balance of the purchase price shall be paid in Federal Funds by wire transfer to the Borough at closing.

Right to Reject Bids; Waive Irregularities

The Borough reserves the right to reject any and all Bids and to the extent permitted by law to waive any irregularity or informality in any Bid.

Delivery of the Bonds

The Bonds will be delivered on or about August 21, 2025 (UNLESS A NOTICE OF A CHANGE IN THE DELIVERY DATE IS PUBLISHED ON PARITY NOT LATER THAN TWO (2) HOURS PRIOR TO ANY ANNOUNCED DATE FOR RECEIPT OF BIDS) in New York, New York at the offices of DTC against payment of the purchase price therefor (less the amount of the good faith deposit). PAYMENT FOR THE BONDS AT THE TIME OF ORIGINAL ISSUANCE AND DELIVERY SHALL BE BY WIRE TRANSFER OF IMMEDIATELY AVAILABLE FUNDS.

There will also be furnished the usual closing papers, including (1) a certificate, in form and tenor satisfactory to Bond Counsel and dated as of the date of such delivery of the Bonds, to the effect that there is no litigation pending or (to the knowledge of the signer or signers thereof) threatened affecting the validity of the Bonds, (2) certificates in form satisfactory to Bond Counsel evidencing the proper execution and delivery of the Bonds, the receipt of payment therefor and compliance with the requirements of the Code necessary to preserve tax exemption, (3) a certificate signed by the Borough relating to the Official Statement, and (4) a Continuing Disclosure Certificate evidencing compliance with SEC Rule 15c2-12 and the undertaking of the Borough with respect thereto.

Establishment of Issue Price for the Bonds

In the event the Borough receives at least three (3) bids for the Bonds, then the Issue Price for the Bonds shall be established based on the reasonably expected initial offering prices of the Bonds as of the Bid Date (the "Expected Offering Prices"). The Expected Offering Prices shall consist of the prices for each maturity of the Bonds used by the winning bidder in formulating its bid to purchase the Bonds. The winning bidder shall be required to deliver on the Delivery Date a certificate to such effect, and provide to the Borough, in writing, the Expected Offering Prices as of the Bid Date.

In the event the Borough receives fewer than three (3) bids for the Bonds, then the Issue Price for the Bonds shall be established based on the first price at which at least 10% of each maturity of the Bonds was sold to the Public (as defined below). The winning bidder shall be required to deliver on the Delivery Date a certificate to such effect, and provide to the Borough, in writing, evidence satisfactory to Bond Counsel to the Borough of such sales prices for each maturity of the Bonds. In the event that the winning bidder has not sold at least 10% of each maturity of the Bonds to the Public as of the Delivery Date (each, an "Unsold Maturity"), the winning bidder shall (i) provide to the Borough, in writing, on the Delivery Date, the Expected Offering Prices for each Unsold Maturity and a certificate regarding same and (ii) have a continuing obligation to provide to the Borough, in writing, evidence satisfactory to Bond Counsel to the Borough of the first price at which at least 10% of each Unsold Maturity is sold to the Public, contemporaneous with each such sale, until at least 10% of all such Unsold Maturities have been sold to the Public.

Public means any person (including an individual, trust, estate, partnership, association, company, or corporation) other than an Underwriter (as defined herein) or a related party to an Underwriter. The term "related party" generally means any two or more persons who have greater than 50 percent common ownership, directly or indirectly. Underwriter means (i) any

person that agrees pursuant to a written contract with the Borough (or with the lead underwriter to form an underwriting syndicate) to participate in the initial sale of the Bonds to the Public, and (ii) any person that agrees pursuant to a written contract directly or indirectly with a person described in clause (i) of this paragraph to participate in the initial sale of the Bonds to the Public (including a member of a selling group or a party to a retail distribution agreement participating in the initial sale of the Bonds to the Public).

CUSIP Identification Numbers

It is anticipated that CUSIP Identification Numbers will be printed on the Bonds. The Municipal Advisor to the Borough, will timely apply for CUSIP Identification Numbers with respect to the Bonds as required by MSRB Rule G-34. The CUSIP Service Bureau charge for the assignment of the numbers shall be the responsibility of and shall be paid for by the successful bidder. The successful bidder will be responsible for notifying CUSIP Global Services of any changes in structure and shall add or cancel CUSIP numbers as needed to conform to the final structure. The Borough will assume no obligation for the assignment or printing of such numbers on the Bonds or for the correctness of such numbers, and neither the failure to print such numbers on any Bond nor any error with respect thereto shall constitute cause for a failure or refusal by the successful bidder thereof to accept delivery of and make payment for the Bonds.

Legal Opinion

The approving opinion of Archer & Greiner P.C., Red Bank, New Jersey, Bond Counsel to the Borough, will be furnished without cost to the Winning Bidder, such opinion to be substantially in the form set forth in the Official Statement distributed in preliminary form in connection with the sale of the Bonds, to the effect that the Bonds are valid and legally binding obligations of the Borough, unless paid from other sources, that all the taxable property therein will be subject to the levy of *ad valorem* taxes to pay the Bonds and the interest thereon without limitation as to rate or amount and that interest on the Bonds is not includable as gross income under current law if the Borough complies with all conditions subsequent contained in the Code, except to the extent that interest on the Bonds held by certain corporate holders of the Bonds indirectly may be subject to the federal alternative minimum tax, and that interest on the Bonds and any gain on the sale thereof is not includable as gross income under the existing New Jersey Gross Income Tax Act.

Postponement

The Borough reserves the right to postpone, from time to time, the date and time established for receipt of Bids. ANY SUCH POSTPONEMENT WILL BE PUBLISHED ON PARITY, BEFORE 11:00 A.M. ON THE DAY OF THE SALE. If any date fixed for the receipt of Bids and the sale of the Bonds is postponed, an alternative sale date will be announced via PARITY at least forty-eight (48) hours prior to such alternative sale date. On any such alternative sale date, any Bidder may submit a Bid for the purchase of the Bonds in conformity in all respects with the provisions of this Notice of Sale, except for the date of sale and except for the changes announced on PARITY at the time the sale date and time are announced.

Termination

The Winning Bidder at its option may refuse to accept the Bonds if prior to their delivery any change in any income tax law of the United States of America, shall provide that the interest thereon is includable or shall be includable in gross income at a future date for Federal income tax

purposes. In such case, the deposit made by such Winning Bidder shall be returned and such bidder will be relieved of its contractual obligations arising from the acceptance of its Winning Bid.

Clarification of Notice of Sale Terms

The Borough may, in its sole discretion and prior to the electronic receipt of proposals, clarify any term hereof, including, without limitation, its decision to discontinue use of electronic bidding via PARITY, by publishing the clarification on PARITY, or any other available means, no later than 3:00 p.m., prevailing New Jersey time, on the last business day prior to the Bid Date.

Bank Qualification

The Bonds will be designated "qualified tax-exempt obligations" of the Borough for the purposes of section 265(b)(3)(B)(ii) of the Code and the Borough will represent that it reasonably expects that neither it nor its subordinate entities will issue in the aggregate more than \$10,000,000 of tax-exempt obligations, other than obligations described in section 265(b)(3)(C)(ii) of the Code, in the current calendar year (2025).

Maturity Schedule Adjustment By The Borough

The Chief Financial Officer of the Borough may, up to 24 hours prior to the date of advertised sale of and within 4 hours after the award of the Bonds, adjust the maturity schedule of the Bonds in increments of \$5,000, provided, however, that after the award of the Bonds (i) no maturity schedule adjustment shall exceed 10% upward or downward of the principal for any maturity as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and (ii) the aggregate adjustment to the maturity schedule shall not exceed 10% upward or downward of the aggregate principal amount of bonds as specified herein (or as adjusted prior to the date of advertised sale) and as adjusted will not exceed the amount authorized by the ordinance(s) authorizing the issuance of the Bonds. NOTICE OF ANY ADJUSTMENT TO THE MATURITY SCHEDULE OF THE BONDS PRIOR TO THE DATE OF THE ADVERTISED SALE SHALL BE GIVEN BY CAUSING A NOTICE THEREOF TO BE PUBLISHED VIA TM3. The dollar amount bid by the successful bidder shall be adjusted to reflect any adjustments in the aggregate principal amount of bonds to be issued. The adjusted bid price will reflect changes in the dollar amount of the underwriter's discount and the original issue premium or discount, but will not change the per bond underwriter's discount as calculated from the bid and the Initial Public Offering Prices required to be delivered to the Borough as stated herein. The Borough shall notify the successful bidder of the final maturity schedule and the resulting adjusted purchase price no later than 5:00 p.m., New Jersey time, on the day of the sale and award of the Bonds. The interest rate or rates specified by the successful bidder for each maturity will not be altered.

Successful Bidder ELEC Filing

The successful bidder is advised of its responsibility to file an annual disclosure statement on political contributions with the New Jersey Election Law Enforcement Commission ("ELEC") pursuant to N.J.S.A. 19:44A-20.13 (P.L. 2005, c.271, s.3) if the successful bidder enters into agreements or contracts, such as its agreement to purchase the Bonds, with a public entity, such as the Borough and receives compensation or fees in excess of \$50,000 in the aggregate from public entities, such as the Borough, in a calendar year. It is the successful bidder's responsibility to determine if filing is necessary. Failure to do so can result in the imposition of financial penalties by ELEC.
